PROJECT SCOPE

Perched on a bluff overlooking Lake Michigan, North Shore Congregation Israel has been a landmark of modern religious architecture since its completion in 1964. Designed by acclaimed architect Minoru Yamasaki, the synagogue's iconic sanctuary was recognized by the American Institute of Architects as one of Illinois' 200 Great Places. Eckenhoff Saunders led the revitalization of Frank Memorial Hall and Rebecca K. Crown Social Hall, along with security, accessibility, and operational improvements throughout the campus. The renovations preserve the building's architectural legacy while enhancing its flexibility, functionality, and hospitality for today's congregation.

Frank Memorial Hall (4,900 sf)

Originally conceived as a formal lobby, Frank Memorial Hall was transformed into a welcoming, multi-purpose gathering space that supports casual interaction, adult education, informal meetings, and overflow seating during worship services. The renovation strengthens connections to the north terrace and south lawn, creating opportunities for indoor-outdoor events.

Key improvements include:

- Refreshed finishes and architectural lighting
- Flexible lounge seating for gathering, learning, music, and lectures
- Enhanced technology, acoustics, and hospitality amenities

Rebecca K. Crown Social Hall (5,300 sf)

The renovation of the congregation's primary banquet and event space introduced contemporary finishes, adaptable technology, and upgraded building systems while improving comfort and energy performance. New glazing creates a stronger connection to a lakeside terrace that accommodates religious services and community celebrations.

Additional improvements to the administrative offices and primary entrances enhance daily operations while strengthening campus security, ensuring the facility continues to serve future generations without compromising its architectural significance.
